Here is a little taster of some of the great learning that has taken place in Beech class this term.



Hidden Figures

This has been our book of the term and the children have produced some wonderful newspaper articles and persuasive letters inspired by the book. The children were somewhat surprised at the adversity through discrimination that these amazing women faced.



<u>Maths</u> In Maths this term, we have practised adding and subtracting fractions and solved problems using long multiplication and bus-stop division.



Earth and Space

The children have learned that the sun is the centre of our solar system. The sun, moon and Earth are approximately spherical bodies. The Earth orbits the sun whilst the moon orbits the Earth - both in an anticlockwise direction. The Earth spins on its own axis in an anticlockwise direction and it is the movement of the Earth that creates night and day. The moon is not a light source, it reflects light from the sun. We have looked at the sizes of the planets in the solar system and the relative distances they are from the sun.



Ancient Maya Civilisation

We now know when and where the Maya lived, why they were so successful, how they were ruled and the similarities to Anglo-Saxon England.

This term our focus artist has been Tony Cragg. We have embraced our inner sculptors to create some amazing sculptures.
