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Update from Mrs Deevoy and Miss Crowe

Welcome back to Term 4. We have finally said goodbye to the temporary heating in each classroom as KCC have installed a brand new boiler in the main school building. In typical fashion, this is ready just as the weather warms up! The Sports Hall boiler is still awaiting parts, so all the mobile heaters have been moved in there for the time being meaning assemblies should be a little more toasty from now on.

The snagging works on the new outdoor installations (seating & performance space and outdoor classroom) are now complete and these will be in use from this term. Please do NOT allow your children to play on these after school. This is particularly important for younger siblings.

As well as our new outdoor installations, we also need to celebrate the increased rates of reading practice across the school. This still varies from class to class but it is clear that those children who are now practising the skills they are learning in school every day at home are making great progress towards reading fluency. We'll be sending out more information about reading later this term.

There will be information coming out soon regarding an election for a parent governor. If you are able to commit to up to 9 meetings a year (evenings), undertaking training (a mixture of face to face and online) and regular visits to the school for your area of responsibility then please consider standing. Our governors hold an important legal and strategic position in the federation and their support and challenge is valued.

A few reminders

Please leave the playground immediately after pick up to allow after school clubs to come out promptly. Feel free to chat in the car-park if you wish.

The weather remains changeable so please ensure your child has a suitable coat, even if the morning is sunny and warm.

Children should only bring rucksacks to school if they are going to stay at a different house that evening. These should be handed to the school office.

Any change of clothes for after school clubs should be in drawstring bags and kept on pegs. Black leggings or jogging bottoms can be worn on any day along with plain BLACK trainers. Normal trainers are fine for PE days only. All school shoes should be suitable for running and sports. If you think your child may have conjunctivitis, please see a pharmacist and start treatment before sending them into school. If in doubt please get checked out.

School Attendance

We are really pleased that this year school attendance has improved compared to the last 2 years; thank you for working with us. Please don't forget to ring or e-mail us on each day of your child's absence. If your child is given medication (4 times a day) but is well enough to be in school, we are happy to administer medication at set times to avoid further absences.

Here are our attendance figures (non cumulative) so far this year:

There's still much more to do to get our attendance figure up to at least the national average (over 96.5%) and in line with national expectations for primary pupils, so let's continue this positive trend by securing an even higher percentage at the end of Term 4. Our current total attendance for the year to date stands at: **94.0**%

It is clear from our data that those who attend regularly are making good progress. So thank you for your help and hard work in getting your children to school, even on those days when staying under the duvet seems more appealing!

School Pantomime

As part of our enrichment curriculum, the whole school were treated to a pantomime entitled Jack, Jill and the Beanstalk. This was followed by a special 'Magic Bean' dinner. A great day was had by all, even the adults joined in with the 'it's behind you!' chants.
