The Summer terms are great for sporting events and this term kicked off (excuse the pun) by some of our Year 6 children entering a Tag Rugby competition in which they all came back with medals! We were very proud of their sportsmanship and how well they represented our school. We look forward to many more sporting events this term.

Willow class have had an amazing term so far! They have all enjoyed writing their own poems inspired by Lord Byron ready to be displayed in the church as part of the Lower Halstow Poetry Festival. They wrote all about the seasons and what they might see and do in each season. Amelie's favourite season was Summer as it reminded her of the colours pink, yellow, orange and red. Alice liked Winter as it reminded her of the colours pastel blue, white, sky blue, muted purple and navy. Priscilla's favourite thing this term was the lemonade stand. The children made their own lemonade and then sold it after school to raise money for WWF as part of the school's Charity Week. They had to create their own posters, research recipes and carefully consider the pricing. Dylan told us that we needed to have water, lemons, cups, honey and sugar. Willow added that we need "strawberries and raspberries for strawberry lemonade" which Christopher thought should be called 'Strawberryade'.

The children have started a wonderful topic based around Kenya, they have had great fun comparing the village in 'Lila and the Secret of the Rain' with our village, Lower Halstow.

Willow class have had a fabulous year and cannot believe it is Term 6 already! They've learnt so much and cannot wait for the adventures of Year 3.'
