Dear Mums, Dads and Carers

We have certainly had a busy year again, with many changes occurring around the school. This year we have seen the installation of our amphitheater and outdoor classroom which have provided additional outdoor seating and learning spaces. The PTA donated funds for the trim trail which is being used extensively and proving very popular.

Our Forest School has been developed with extra shrubs and a new covered area. The area has really been put to good use with Year R and 1 children having regular slots. Other year groups have accessed the Forest School through after school clubs, however from September Mrs Atkins, our Forest School leader, will be released from class one afternoon a week to allow further classes to continue their learning within the Forest School.

A large amount of money has been spent on early years with Acorn class receiving a complete revamp. Their classroom has been painted, new flooring laid and the old brightly coloured worn furniture replaced with natural wood. The room is now so tranquil and all resources are more easily accessible to the children. The change in their engagement, creativity and levels of independence has been really impressive.

The teachers have all been busy ensuring that they get the best out of the children and gaps left from Covid continue to be filled using interventions and other catch up support. As always the staff have gone above and beyond to provide exciting learning opportunities and continued support for the children in their care as befits our school vision.

Thank you for your ongoing support for the Lower Halstow team. We wish you a very restful summer and we look forward to seeing all of you on Monday 4th September.

UNIFORM

The 'active' inform, which was introduced this year, has worked really well both for saving time with children not getting changed for PE, as well as saving parents money buying two sets of uniform for class based learning and PE. This has also enabled greater levels of other activity as part of lessons outside of just PE.

Our active uniform consists of the following:

Footwear	PLAIN black trainers or shoes suitable for sport (optional black plimsolls or plain white trainers on PE days if you wish)	
Tops	Plain/logoed white polo shirt (optional white T-shirt on PE days if you wish) Plain/logoed royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan/fleece	
Bottoms	PLAIN black or navy blue leggings, shorts or jersey jogging bottor Grev trousers, skirts, shorts (optional blue shorts on PE days if yo

We continue to ask pupils to wear their blue sweatshirts or cardigans everyday including PE days. No other sportswear is permitted.

Summer dresses /playsuits are still part of our uniform.

No item of uniform has been stopped, so you can still hand items down if you have siblings in school.

This year we have seen some trainers with colourful logos or soles creeping in as well as branded sportswear hoodies and sweatshirts. **These are not permitted uniform and will not be allowed in September.** We encourage ALL pupils to wear PLAIN black trainers to school daily as we undertake the Daily Mile, yoga, dance and now have active playtimes with a variety of sports on offer. Plain black school shoes are still permitted if you prefer these but they *should be suitable for active playtimes* and sporting activities, including PE lessons. Given the fact we now have the trim trail, black trainers are even more important and often shoes do not provide enough grip on this type of equipment.

Forsters <u>www.forsterskent.co.uk</u> offer all these items but plain items, including footwear are also available from all supermarkets.

Our 'New to You' uniform is still available and offers a range of items in different sizes. If there are any items that you are interested in please send an e-mail into the school office and then Mrs Fox will prepare some items for your perusal.

ENTRY TO SCHOOL

Classrooms will open at **8.30am** and pupils need to be in school by **8.45am** at the latest.

Y1 – Y6 please continue to drop your children at the main gate. New YR parents will be dropping on the playground and we want to keep things calm and quiet on site at the start of the day for everyone. Please only come onsite if you wish to speak to someone on the gate or if you are helping your child with their belongings or their bike/scooter.

PICK UP FROM SCHOOL

3.15pm pick-up for Y1 – Y6. New reception pupils will be finishing at 3pm for the first 2 weeks. Please can everyone continue to pick up from the main playground and remember to stand where the class teacher can see you to allow us to dismiss the children quickly. If you want your child to walk home please ensure you have emailed the office with permission for this.



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SNACKS

Tuck shop for KS2 pupils will be starting from Monday 11th September run by Year 6. Everything is 20p. Details of what is on offer will be in a ping at the start of term. Please provide a suitable break-time snack for the first week back – fruit, savoury crackers, breadsticks etc. EYFS & KS1 are provided with fruit by the school, so no break-time snack is needed.

PACKED LUNCHES

Please save the chocolate and sweets for home. These will be removed from packed lunches as they adversely affect afternoon learning, so please do not put them in lunchboxes as this causes unnecessary upset. Please use common sense, for example, cereal bars containing a few chocolate drops & Fruit Winders are fine, but snacks such as chocolate covered raisins are not as these melt and cause a mess. Plain raisins are just as sweet.

BAGS

Book bags & drawstring bags only. Just a reminder about this rule. If your child brings a large rucksack the contents will be emptied into a named carrier bag which they can hang on their peg and the rucksack sent to the office to be collected by parents. As the school population has grown we are really pushed for corridor hanging space and this measure has helped keep corridors safe and clear for everyone. Thank you for continuing to help with this.

WATER BOTTLES

Year 2 - 6 pupils need to bring their own clearly named water bottle – any bottles with juice will be emptied and replaced with water so please only send water in. Juice boxes etc. can be included in packed lunches. We will be providing water bottles for Year R and 1 and these will stay in school.

OTHER UNIFORM REMINDERS

Please remember that only small **stud** earrings are allowed in school and pupils must be able to remove these themselves for PE. If your child arrives at school with hooped hearings, they will be asked to remove them, this includes **sleepers**.

Long hair should ideally be tied back for school – this is essential on PE days due to health and safety.

Please also ensure your child has coat, hat, sunscreen as appropriate for the weather as we will continue to use the school grounds for outdoor learning and the British weather is notoriously changeable.
