FOOD FOR THOUGHT: "WHO DO YOU SAY I AM?

"Christ is risen. He is risen indeed! Alleluia!" Such are the words that will ring out every Sunday morning now across the world in this Easter season throughout this month of April. For like Christmas, Easter is not just a day. It is a period when Christians acknowledge the impact of the risen Jesus, not just transforming the lives of his followers then but transforming the world ever since.

This same Jesus had been executed and buried just a few days before. Yet there he stood amongst his friends unmistakably alive, having overcome death. Even the worst thing that anyone could do to another to silence them, by putting them to death, could not prevail. Is this why in recent times the Russian opposition figure Alexei Navalny, a professed Christian, was able to face into his ordeal and eventual death at the hands of Putin's brutal regime? Even death could not hold him.

Christians speak of this as being the greatest day in history. Even as I write these words, I'm sure that there will be some thinking, "really?" Yes, really. For it is not just Christians who say this. For the historian Tom Holland, himself a non-believer, identifies how the values of Western societies have been formed by the disruptive impact of the Christian faith itself rooted in Jesus' resurrection. Where else did our assumptions about "loving your neighbour", "going the extra mile" and being a "good Samaritan" come from"? They condition our responses to

situations such as Gaza, Ukraine and the plight of asylum-seekers and refugees. The prevailing cultural attitudes of ancient times were turned completely on their head. As Holland himself observes in his own words "it is, to coin a phrase, the greatest story ever told"*.

Many found Jesus' teaching tough because it was not what they wanted or expected. He asked his follower Peter at different times, "who do you say I am" and "are you going to leave too?" He replied, "Lord, to who shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We believe and know that you are the Holy One of God".

What about you? Who do you say he is? Not sure? Have questions? Then come and explore them with us.

LOWER HALSTOW PRIMARY SCHOOL

Lower Halstow Primary School
Term 4 has seen the first signs of Spring appear, in between the rain showers, and we have started to enjoy all the activities that take place at this time of year.



This term Year 5 started their block of 12 swimming sessions at Sheerness Swimming Pool. This follows the Government's expectation that swimming and water safety lessons are taught to all primary school children. By the end of primary school each pupil is required to be able to swim 25 metres unaided and use a range of strokes effectively. They have enjoyed their first few sessions and are already gaining confidence in the water and improving their technique.

Year 6 took part in a Team building day which aimed to build their resilience and encourage them to work together as a team to solve a variety of logical and physical challenges where children were required to plan, communicate, work together and stay motivated to solve the problem.

There are few weeks in the school calendar that are more exciting than Book Week. The week got off to a great start when author, Monty Marsh, visited every class to read excerpts from his books, talk about the process of writing a book and answer questions from the children. In addition to this the children have enjoyed taking part in a bingo book quiz at home, bringing in a book from home to swap with other children in the class and dressing up as our favourite character for World Book Day. The week ended with a whole school Book Quiz in which representatives from each house went head to head to be the speediest at answering questions about texts that they had studied in class, this

year Hever House were crowned the winners. We had some brilliant costumes on World Book Day which included Mary Poppins, Alice in Wonderland, several Harry Potters and a beautiful Angelina Ballerina to name just a few.

We still have lots of events planned for the last 3 weeks left of the term including Science Week, a class assembly and various Easter activities so we have a busy time ahead.
