
English

<u>History</u>



This unit will fully explain how World War Two began and gives the children a more comprehensive understanding of how empire and rebellion influenced Hitler and his plan to dominate Europe. The children will explore the significance of the Battle of Britain and complete a local study. They will explore how Britain gained victory in World War Two. So far, the children have learned about the rise of Hitler and how the war started.

The children will continue with their weekly ukulele lesson, building on the skills that they have been practising since their introduction to the instrument in Year 5 as well as developing their understanding of composition.
