Our topic this term is based around the theme of Under the Sea. The texts we will be using include books such as:

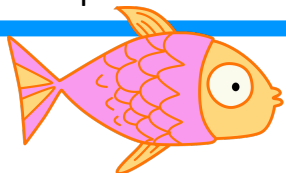

Here are some key parts of our learning:

In Understanding of the World, the children will begin to learn about the sea and what lies beneath it. We will learn about the seaside past and present. We will also explore the season of summer and think about our time in Acorn Class.

In Literacy, alongside enjoying and learning from our themed texts, we will continue with our Little Wandle Phonics programme and further developing our fluency when reading. Perfecting letter formation will continue to be a key focus.

In Maths we will develop and secure our understanding of number by building numbers up to 20. We will consolidate our number bonds to 10 and practice subtraction.
