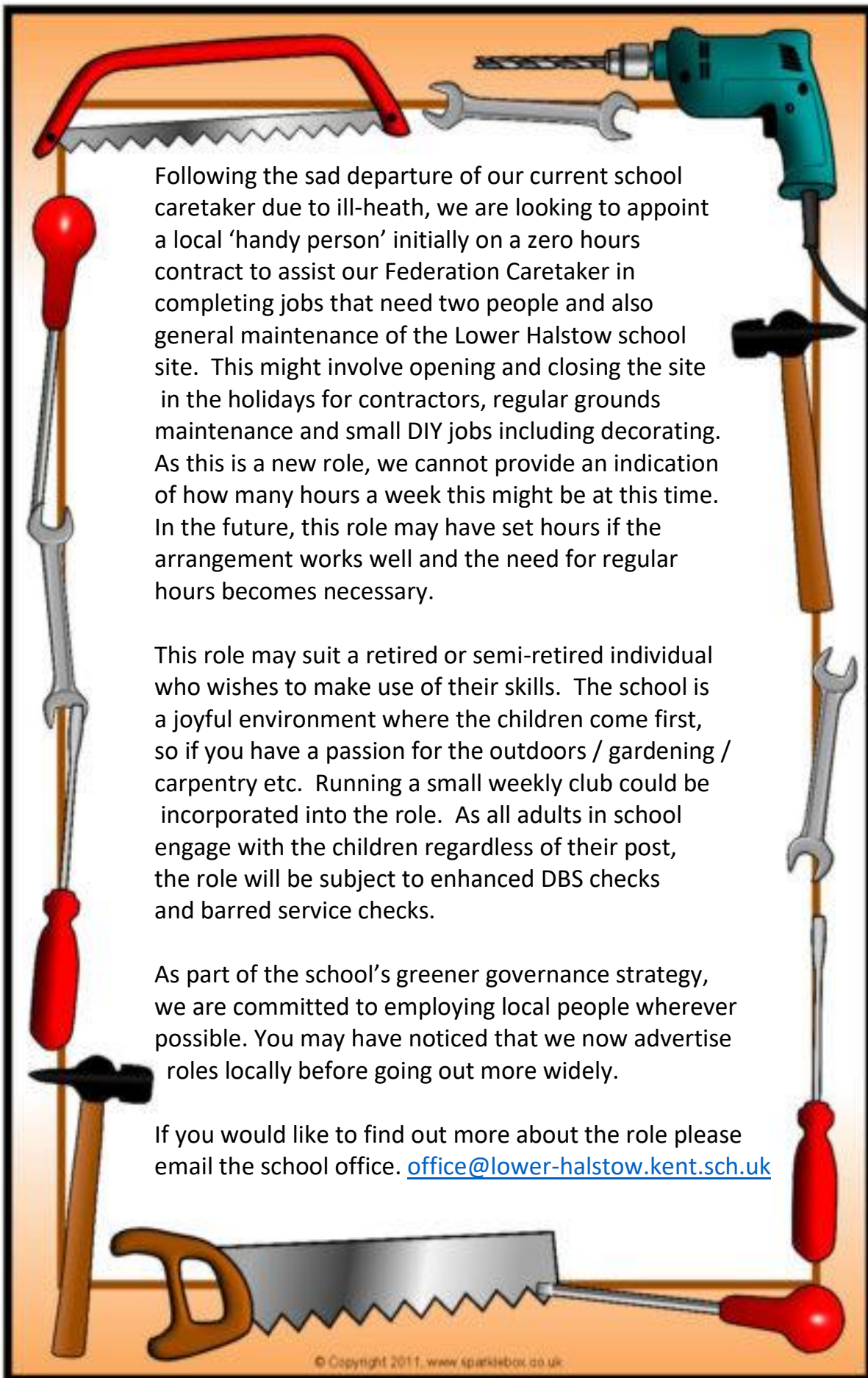

Following the sad departure of our current school caretaker due to ill-health, we are looking to appoint a local 'handy person' initially on a zero hours contract to assist our Federation Caretaker in completing jobs that need two people and also general maintenance of the Lower Halstow school site. This might involve opening and closing the site in the holidays for contractors, regular grounds maintenance and small DIY jobs including decorating. As this is a new role, we cannot provide an indication of how many hours a week this might be at this time. In the future, this role may have set hours if the arrangement works well and the need for regular hours becomes necessary.

This role may suit a retired or semi-retired individual who wishes to make use of their skills. The school is a joyful environment where the children come first, so if you have a passion for the outdoors / gardening / carpentry etc. Running a small weekly club could be incorporated into the role. As all adults in school engage with the children regardless of their post, the role will be subject to enhanced DBS checks and barred service checks.

As part of the school's greener governance strategy, we are committed to employing local people wherever possible. You may have noticed that we now advertise roles locally before going out more widely.

## **SCHOOL GOVERNOR NEEDED**

Experience of working in or with schools (does not need to be recent)

Knowledge of the current national curriculum or a willingness to learn

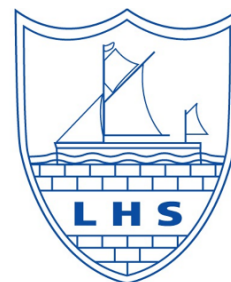
However, if you are really passionate about education and the curriculum and willing to learn, we'd still love to hear from you.

## LOWER HALSTOW PRIMARY SCHOOL

Despite the very 'un-Spring like' weather that we have had so far, the penultimate term of the year has still got off to a busy start!



Our Year 5 pupils managed to dodge the showers in order to complete their Bikeability course. They took their Level 1 and 2 award and all successfully passed; they were awarded with Bikeability certificates and badges certifying that they were able to ride safely in the school grounds and on the roads around the village.

A key highlight of this term was the work the school completed during our annual Eco Week. Every class took part in a litter pick either in the school grounds or around the village of Lower Halstow – our local area is now looking so clean, tidy and litter free. In addition to this, we had a whole school assembly focusing on Earth Day and everyone made a promise of something they were going to do to help the environment.

Year 6 made Eco badges, which they gave to Year 1 to remind them about looking after their environment, they also investigated how long different materials take to decompose and what we can do to save our precious resources. As well as receiving and wearing their badges, the Year 1 children used paint and pom-poms to create pictures of our world and made door hangers to remind themselves of how wonderful our earth is. The Year 4 children used paper plates and hand silhouettes to create a display showing what they have all pledged to do for our environment. The week was rounded off by everyone wearing something green to remind us of how important it is to look after our world.

Our Year 3 children had the most wonderful time learning about our local estuary this term as we took part in the Wild Estuary project. From crabbing to bird spotting, plant identification to environmental impacts, they have thoroughly enjoyed it. The hands-on learning has been a very



special experience for the children and we cannot thank Belinda from Wild Estuary enough.

Year 5 travelled to Margate to visit the Turner Contemporary! They discussed art in the gallery, got creative making their own art, and even spent some time on the beach! Great fun was had by all along with a chance to show off their creative flair.

We celebrated St Georges Day by wearing club uniforms to school, focusing on the theme of 'belonging'. In classes, the children explained about the clubs they attend and what they get involved in, it was really interesting to see the wide range of clubs the children attend outside of school.

It was an important term for our Year 6 pupils as they sat their SATs tests. They all tried very hard and we were so proud at how hard they have worked in the lead up to these assessments. We have the agonising wait for the results now, which will not come out until July. We have fitted so much in so far this term but there is still lots to look forward to in the forthcoming weeks. Hopefully the weather will get the memo that we are in May now so we would ideally like some warmer and drier weather!

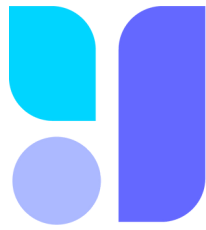
