

Update from Mrs Deevoy and Miss Crowe

Happy New Year! New Year = New Stuff!

We hope you all had a restful Christmas and are ready to start the New Year with a bang. You may have noticed some works commenced just before the holidays. This will be a performance area/play space for the children and an outdoor classroom. We are also working with the PTA to secure a trim trail at some point in the future and further develop our forest school area. We also have a new website <u>www.lower-halstow.kent.sch.uk</u> as our LA provider stopped its hosting service. We will be populating this and transferring everything across over time. A few reminders

Uniform – no hooped earrings, studs only and please remove or tape these on PE days. All pupils are able to wear black jogging bottoms or black leggings on any day (dark grey is also fine for the moment until we fully switch). These should be PLAIN black – no nike swoosh, white piping or similar. Likewise trainers on non PE days should be PLAIN black and velcro if your child can't tie their own shoelaces. We will be moving towards black trainers everyday from next year, so if you replace school trainers at any point, please buy black ones. Feedback on the activewear uniform option has been very positive (particularly for the younger ones).

Attendance - Lower Halstow continues to have one of the highest persistence absence rates in Swale (below 90% is classed as 'persistently absent' and is monitored by the Local Authority). This is mainly due to children having term time holidays in addition to the usual minor illnesses which is affecting the children's progress compared to their classmates. However, our overall attendance is still in line with national due to the majority of children attending school regularly.

Reading – please remember to read regularly at home right up to Y6! Reading miles are how children develop prosody (the easy reading rhythm and fluency that 'good' readers have). This in turn helps comprehension and how the children access materials in school. We will teach them to read, they just need time to practise in order to read quickly enough to develop this. Our army of volunteer readers provide additional help and we are very grateful to them, but nothing can replace daily reading at home for securing fluency.

Changes – Year R are now being dropped at the main gate. Can all parents please be mindful of this and keep the gate clear for the first few days until the children settle into this new routine.

Events – we are really looking forward to our magical 'Jack , Jill and the Beanstalk' themed day in January. Look out for details of the special Magic Bean Dinner that we will be having.

<u>Trips</u>

This term various classes headed off-site for their learning! Our Year 1 and 2 children visited the Gulbenkian Theatre in Canterbury where they watched a performance of 'Under the Frozen Moon'. After the performance they had the opportunity to ask the actors questions which they had prepared back in school. It really was a fantastic experience to be able to watch live theatre and interact with the cast. Year R also headed off to the theatre, however they went to the Brook Theatre in Chatham to see 'The Lighthouse Cat's Christmas Adventure'. Again it was a great experience for the children as part of our enrichment curriuclum.



In Key Stage 2 the older children were also off out and about. Year 6 experienced a day at the Houses of Parliament in London; they had a tour around the Palace of Westminster and considered democracy and the rule of law as they spoke to various representatives from the House. Meanwhile Year 4 headed off to

the Maidstone Museum to learn about the Ancient Egyptians. Whilst there they examined artefacts and learnt about the mummification process, they even tried it out on an orange!
