Where possible we try to use Makaton. Makaton is a language programme that uses signs, symbols, and speech to help people communicate. Makaton is designed to support spoken language, not replace it so this means that when we use Makaton, we speak and sign simultaneously. It is a fun yet powerful tool and benefits children in several ways:

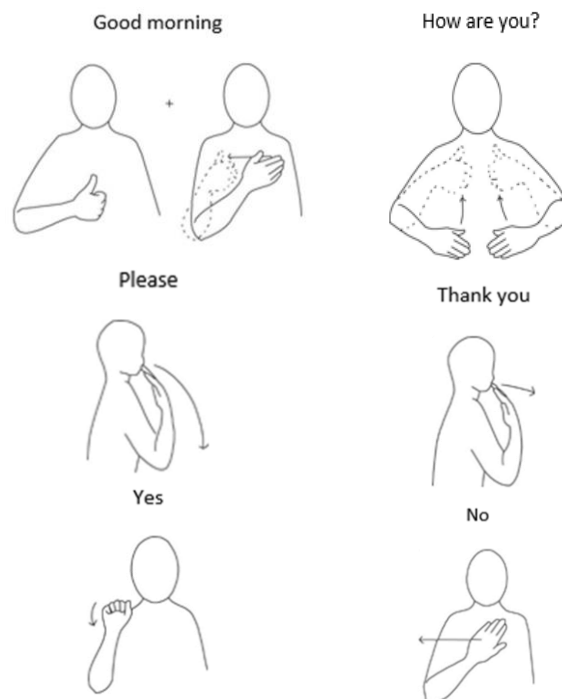
- For children who have difficulty speaking or understanding spoken language, Makaton provides an accessible way to express themselves and understand others.
- Using signs and symbols alongside speech helps reinforce key concepts and ideas, making learning more engaging and memorable.
- Makaton empowers children to communicate effectively, boosting their confidence and self-esteem.
- Teaching all children Makaton creates an inclusive environment where everyone can communicate and connect, regardless of their abilities.

### Meet the Makaton Ambassadors

Each class has their very own Makaton Ambassador. The Ambassadors meet weekly to learn the new 'Signs of the week'. They then have the task of teaching these to the rest of the class and encouraging use around school.
