FRIENDS OF THE BRICKFIELDS

You may have noticed the paths are not up to our usual standard this summer - we managed to break both the FotB's and my Brushcutter at the same time! I have been doing bits by hand when out with the dogs. On the plus side I managed to avoid cutting a path where there were very many Ladybird instars and larvae so saved them from getting mashed. This selective cutting is definitely better for the wildlife.

We have not held work parties this summer, it's been too hot, if anyone would like to take a pair of secateurs out with them, feel free to snip any overhanging stuff. The general rule I use is to cut back if it's heading for the path but if it has masses of hips, haws, etc., I try to cut less off to leave as much food as possible for the wildlife. There are one or two places which need a big cut back but it would create too much disturbance to do it during the nesting season - you'll just have to duck!

This winter will be busy; hedge cutting, cutting back the path sides, thinning trees out, spreading shingle to reinforce the muddier paths and, of course, the reed bed cut. There'll be monthly work parties, usually on the second week-end of the month. Dates will be advertised on our Facebook page, in the Village News and, probably, on the Lapwing Drive entrance gate. All welcome, we will need all the help we can get. Unfortunately, we do not yet have a date for the reed bed cut which is

the biggest work event of the year but it will be late September / early October.

Enjoy summer on the Brickie, but please, please do NOT light fires over there, the area is tinder dry and you could cause an out of control wildfire which would be a disaster and would cause loss of life. A circle of old bricks is not enough to stop the fire spreading out in the underlying peat.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT/PASTORAL LETTER

I hope that you are enjoying the summer months – but which seem, as always, to be rushing past so quickly. I wonder what you have been doing and what you may be planning now for the days ahead. I expect that you will have had a mix of very normal day to day stuff but also, perhaps, a few out of the ordinary things too. Maybe you have been on a holiday. Maybe you have been able to meet up with friends and family – perhaps even to celebrate something special. Maybe you have been surprised by good news. Maybe you are now anticipating a new start - at school or college or work...

Unfortunately, not all of our time is upbeat, though, and you may, sadly, have been shocked by something unexpected and be experiencing a time of grief. I am sorry if you are. As human beings life can sometimes feel as if we are on a roller coaster and coping with life changes can be so hard. And yet this is life.

I've been thinking about this and remembering the passage in the bible from Ecclesiastes 3:1-8.

A contemporary version reads like this;

Everything on earth has its own time and its own season.

There is a time for birth and death, planting and reaping,
for killing and healing, destroying and building,
for crying and laughing, weeping and dancing,

for throwing stones and gathering stones, embracing and parting.

This is a really great description of how life offers us so many different phases – both as an individual and as community. Sometimes we feel that we have control over what is happening but quite often we can feel disturbed, uncomfortable and challenged....

What I would say to you is that God says to us that whatever is happening in our lives he is with us in it all. He knows and understands. He loves and cares. He rejoices - and weeps - with us. This doesn't mean that the difficult things don't happen – but that whatever we are going through God is present. He will give us sufficient grace to get through each day. He will give us the courage to face all things and the strength that we need. This is Good News. I pray that in all the seasons of life you will know God's blessing.
