



What is happening in Oak class in Term 6?

We have a busy term to look forward to.

English

Our English work, this term, will be based on Cath Ard's book, *Yellowstone (Earth's Incredible Places)*, which links with our Geography unit of earlier in the year – the Western United States.



Geography

We will be completing a fieldwork study unit where we will be mapping the forest school. The children will be taking measurements and readings that we are going to record in a book, so that future generations of Year 6 children will be able to compare their results.

Science

We will revisit a few of the areas of Maths that the children struggled with during the year, as well as exploring a range of reasoning and problem-solving challenges.

We also try to give the children a daily opportunity to use TTRS.

We will continue our weekly number bonds challenge, as so far only Max has completed it!

P. E.

Our P.E. days will be Monday and Fridays so please make sure that your child is wearing suitable clothing on those days. This term our two sports are tennis and athletics, as well as a little practice for the children's final primary school sport's day.



Art

In Art we will be looking at the work of David Krakov and creating a 3D sculpture inspired by his work.

Our week-long activities week starts on Monday 8th June 2026 and finishing on Friday 12th June 2026.

Day 1 ~ A trip to Mote Park in Maidstone where the children will have a session on the Sky Trail, the climbing wall, mini golf and the adventure playground.

Day 2 ~ A day at Riverside Park taking part in pond dipping, a mini beast trail, orienteering and a session in the play area.

Day 3 ~ A tour of the Priestfield Stadium and the children's final sports day at primary school.

Day 4 ~ Chessington where they can enjoy a range of rides and adventures.

Day 5 ~ A visit to the Turner Contemporary Gallery in Whitstable, followed by a game of ten-pin bowling.
